Continuing Violin- My child would like to continue taking Violin Classes. One Elective Choice will be substituted for Violin.

Checking this box does NOT sign you up. You would get a sign up sheet for Guitar (like Violin) that lists what is required, times, etc.. Check this box if you are interested.*

Keyboard- My student would be interested in taking Keyboard lessons. *This is not a guarantee that the class will be offered, we are only checking to see what the interest is. Checking this box does NOT sign you up. You would get a sign up sheet for Keyboard (like Violin) that lists what is required, times, etc.. Check this box if you are interested.*

* "No classes interest me" helps us see if we need to make a change in course offering or possibly add another class. Only choose if NO classes interest student. Older students might even have an option of volunteering in another class.

These classes are MANDATORY and only listed on this form so there is less confusion.

Latin for Children A (Part One) -This course is mandatory for CCA students enrolled in our academic program. Curriculum used is by Classical Academic Press. (See Curriculum order form). This class is now a two year class due to its rigorous approach and student's need to have more advanced grammar instruction. *Instructor Mrs. Heidi Ingram*

Latin for Children B (Part One) -Pre-requisite of Latin for Children A or equivalent. This course is mandatory for CCA students enrolled in our academic program. Curriculum used is by Classical Academic Press. (see Curriculum order form) This class will be a two year class for this group of students only due to its rigorous approach and student's need to have more advanced grammar instruction. *Instructor Mrs. Heidi Ingram*

Following is a brief description of elective classes being offered for the Spring:

New Violin students must complete the application. Please do not choose Violin "Continue". One of your child's choices will be substituted for Violin.

Returning Violin Students must choose "Returning to Violin" if they wish to continue Violin. One of your child's choices will be removed so your child can take Violin.

Returning Spanish Students must choose "Spanish Continue." This is a year long course and no new students will be accepted in the Spring.

Golf (ALL)- Skills and correct forms are taught in putting, chipping, pitching, bunkers, and full swing. Students will also learn the rules and etiquette of the game. Students may bring their own clubs to practice with.

PE (Varies)-This class will include both Presidential Fitness Challenge and various sports. Students will need to do an additional 30 minutes twice a week of exercise to qualify for Presidential Fitness. Students must wear tennis shoes and dress out in order to participate. BRAIN BOOSTERS and MIND BENDERS (1-4th)-This class will focus on developing higher level and critical thinking skills with hands-on activities and games. We will practice creative problem scenarios that will teach evaluation skills and how to create an action plan. Children will exercise "thinking out of the box" to stimulate thought processes which will benefit other subject areas. *Mrs. Brenda Cooner*

Introduction to Music (1st-3rd)- children learn fundamental music skills and concepts. They have exposure to many different kinds of music, rhymes and rhythms. Students will be introduced to music theory and learn about several composers. *Instructor TBA*

Computer I (1-4th)- Students learn computer basics, keyboarding, graphics, word processing basics, computer navigations, spreadsheets, and web browsing basics. For beginning to intermediate students. There is a \$10 computer fee if you are new to computer class this school year. *Mrs. Joan Campbell Instructor*

Computer II (3rd-5th)- Students work on different Computer fundamentals like Word processing, Graphics, Visual mapping, Database, Spreadsheets, Graphing, Presentation, Web browsing. For intermediate to advanced students. There is a \$10 computer fee if you are new to computer class this school year. *Mrs. Joan Campbell Instructor*

Vocal Choir (3rd-HS)- No prior music experience or knowledge is required. The student will be introduced to the basic choral techniques ,vocal warm-ups, harmonization, breathing, posture and performance standards, etc. \$8 supply fee will be invoiced. *Instructor Amy DeFrance*

Journalism(5th-HS)- This course will provide students with the opportunity to refine their writing and publication skills in the production of the school's yearbook. A major focus of the course will be in the planning, development, production, and publication. A camera is helpful, but not mandatory. 5th thru HS. THIS CLASS offered at NO COST TO HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS! *Instructor Mrs. Lizz King*

Sign Language Choir (6th-HS)- This elective will give students the opportunity to learn sign language in a creative and expressive setting. They will learn choreography as they work together in a group for the best effect in expressing the meaning and interpretation of select songs. Students will be evaluated on their participation, dedication, and creative growth. The choir will perform for at least one school event. *Instructor Mrs. Karen Loderhose*

Archery(4th-HS) - Students will learn proper techniques, rules and history of archery. Students can bring their own bows. Please check with instructor for guidelines. \$10 supply fee per student for supplies. *Instructor Mr. Richard Davis*

Racquetball (5th-HS)- This class is designed to help players who are just beginning the game. Students will learn the basics of each stroke, stretching, proper handling of the racquet, eye/hand coordination skills, forehand techniques, and backhand techniques. *Instructor Mrs. Brenda Cooner*

Dance (Varies)- The session will start with 6 weeks of each of the following: Irish-A dance style originating in Ireland where the foot work is the most important part of the dance. If you've seen River Dance this would be an introductory class of the soft shoe style of this dance. Musical Theater-A form of theater combining music,song, dialog and dance. Cheer dance- This class takes cheer elements and dance elements and combines them. Focusing on flexibility,jumps,strong arms,body placement,quick paced choreography and transitional timing. Shoes needed will be Footundies or jazz shoes preferable or if you already own ballet shoes, that is fine. \$15 fee for this class. *Teacher: Marantha Dance Studio*

Tennis (ALL)- Includes teaching junior ground strokes, movement, court position, keeping score, etc.. All levels are welcome! All supplies provided. A \$5.00 fee for membership into the Junior Tennis Association will be invoiced if you are new this semester. *Lee County Community Tennis Association (USPTA and/or USPTR Certified Instructors)*

Exploring Art! (1st-4th)— Using books as the basis, this class will inspire students to create art with similar qualities. Focusing on such principles and elements as line, color, texture, shape, value, and space. Various art media are explored, including pencil, crayon, marker, colored pencil, chalk, stencils, collage, watercolor, tempera, color mixing, and printmaking. \$10 per student supply fee. *Instructor Mrs. Erica Childs*

Scrapbooking II (ALL)- We will continue to learn the basics of scrapbooking by focusing on layout design and embellishments. This semester we will also explore digital scrapbooking to apply the knowledge we have learned in the first semester to the ever growing world of digital media. \$15.00 Fee for this class. **Must have taken Beginning Scrapbooking in Semester I.** *Instructor Mrs. Erica Childs*

Cheerleading(4th-HS)-teaching the basics and fundamentals of cheerleading techniques such as form, mounting, jumps etc. Students will learn the correct way of cheering so the girls are able to carry that into their performance when it does come to competition or furthering their "cheer career". *Instructor Mrs. Lindsay Glenn*

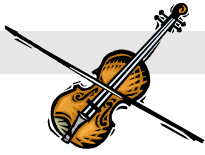
Lego Club (1st-4th)- Lego Club will offer students a fun time to build and create things using the interlocking blocks. Lessons in engineering and thinking "outside the box" will be hidden in the fun. There is a \$10 fee per student for this class. *Instructor Mrs. Lizz King*

Ceramics(4th-HS)- Ceramic painting using different techniques such as sgraffito, marbling, fingerprints,etc. May also be doing some clay hand building and puzzling. Fee \$15. *Instructor Mrs. Gail Reynolds*

Fencing (varies)- Fencing is a fast-paced, one-on-one sport that helps build strength, co-ordination, self-esteem...and it's a lot of fun! \$25.00 fee will be invoiced. *Instructor: Southwest Florida Fencing Academy*

Track(4th-HS)- Students will work on strength, speed and conditioning. Student will also work on relay skills. 7th and higher will have a Track Meet Opportunity in the Spring. *Instructor: Mr. Christopher Baldini*

Junior Engineering, 3D Visualization and Introduction to Robotics! (2nd-5th)- Hands-on critical thinking! Join us as we explore, investigate and solve problems while we learn about the building blocks of engineering, 3D concepts for building and beginning programming concepts! In this class we investigate Simple Machine Lego activities with levers, gears, wheels, pulleys and axles that incorporate math, science, and creativity. In Lego 3D students learn about 3D concepts and visualization along with basic structures. Lots of fun projects while covering topics such as dimension, scale, symmetry and reflection, rotational symmetry, projection and more! Beginning programming concepts are taught while using Roamer Robot and Bee-Bot – our tiny robot from the UK! Students learn how to “talk” to a robot and then program them to follow their commands. We’ll program Roamer to draw different shapes, measure, play music and follow directions on a map. This is a great hands-on technology class that engages students! *Instructor: Mrs. Michelle Hershey from Computer Explorers.*

Application to enroll in Suzuki Violin

Mrs. Kara Griffith will be teaching Suzuki Violin to interested students beginning in the Fall of 2009. Please carefully read this application and return it with your Elective Enrollment form. Class day and time will be set after interest and ability is assessed. This will mean another elective class will be removed from your elective choices so your child can take Violin. All applications should be received no later than May 22, 2009.

New students: Students who have never had violin lesson will be accepted if they are in the 1st, 2nd or 3rd grade. If you have an older student, you can complete the application, but we make no guarantee a class will be offered. We will need to see if we have enough older students who would be new to violin who would like Violin.

Continuing Students: Students who have had lessons before (Suzuki Book Volume 2 or higher) can be in any grade.

Parent Responsibility: Parents are asked to be an active part of the violin lessons and will be asked to attend lessons with their child. Parents should understand that attendance at the lessons will aide parents to help their child at home. Please attend as often as you can; understanding that the more you attend the easier your at home practice days will be and the better your student will do. Students **MUST** practice daily for 20-30 minutes for the best results.

Class size: Class sizes are limited. Choosing Violin will limit your child's elective choices as the lesson will replace another elective choice.

Instrument/Book: Students must either own a violin, rent one or rent-to-own. Cadence Music rental prices start at \$20 a month. Parents are responsible for making arrangements for the rental of the instrument 275-6262. Book and CD will be billed by CCA and will cost between \$14.00-\$20.00 total (depending on the volume).
