Learning at Home

- On Tuesday and Thursday, your child will learn at home.
- Your teacher will provide you with ideas that complement what students are learning in class.
- Completion is NOT required, but can be used to reinforce what your student is learning in class.
- It can also serve as practice work for Kindergarten work expectations.
- You can expect much of this to feel like playing and reading together.

Our youngest learners are in the early Grammar stage of learning.

- They love structure, repetition and showing off what they know.
- Memorization is essential in this stage and children at CCA are found singing, chanting, reading and math facts.
- Developmentally, this is the perfect time to establish a strong foundation of basic information used for future learning.

CCA recognizes students' minds develop at different times, but in a relatively predictable manner.

- In the Kinder-Prep class, your child will spend time learning positive classroom behaviors like taking turns and sharing.
- They will be introduced to the alphabet and letter sounds, numbers and values.
- They will also study God's wonderful creation through Bible, science and artistic exploration.
- Students do need to come to school fully potty trained.



Our young learners have structured lessons designed to be hands-on and engaging.

- Those dedicated times are broken up with a snack, two recesses, lunch and a rest time.
- We know it is best to let children move and keep their bellies full!
- At the end of the day, they have active-learning electives in art, music and physical education.

What is the schedule?

Please note...

All new students are tested for Math and Language Arts placement

- These classes take place at the same time so students can easily move to a different classroom in order to work on-level if necessary.
- Lower School students get two recess breaks during the day. We try to schedule one indoor and one outdoor recess.

Science and History topics rotate each year

- Kindergarten – 5th grade students study the same science
- 1st – 5th grade students study the same history
- Students in different grades will study the same material, but will complete assignments with different, grade-appropriate expectations.
