The Hybrid Program is CCA's most popular enrollment option.

Families often choose CCA's Hybrid Program for the following reasons:

- Families want less autonomy in their child's education
- The idea of choosing curriculum, ensuring graduation standards are met, and teaching high-level courses is simply unappealing.
- Families value expertise and support our staff provides in preparing students for post-graduation success.
- They appreciate knowing their students are working toward earning an accredited diploma and will have transcripts, which simplifies the college application process
- Students attend on-campus classes every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday.
- They learn new material at home every Tuesday and Thursday with lesson plans provided by their teachers.
- Parents have teacher manuals and the support of the teacher on at-home days.
- Teachers are available to support parents and students on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

◀ FLEX

This university-style program allows students enrolled at CCA to choose the classes they'd like to take. Students can choose to take up to four courses – or none at all.

Benefits to FLEX families include:

- Accountability—our guidance counselor oversees attendance, makes course suggestions, and ensures graduation requirements are met.
- With CCA's careful oversight of Flex Students' educations, we can attest to the quality of their education.
- Flex students are enrolled at CCA and will earn an accredited diploma and will also have transcripts from our school.
- Students in 7th-12th grade make their schedules by combining the following options to fit their needs:
 - homeschool
 - on-campus
 - dual-enrollment classes

◀ GUEST

CCA is pleased to invite students who want to remain enrolled as homeschoolers or at another umbrella school to take up to four courses with CCA and pay for the services that interest them.

Benefits to GUEST families include:

- Students may add services like guidance counseling or standardized tests, and participate in our extracurricular activities and social events.
- Guest families who want some or all of their classes taught by our quality teachers.
- Allow an option for athletes who want to play for other local schools, but want to receive a Classical, Christian education.
- Families to determine their own educational plan for their students.
